PROWIBO delivered free short courses to over 300 students to date, covering topics from tech to health to finance, bringing academic expertise from around the world to support and extend the fantastic work already being done in partner organizations.

This year PROWIBO is running short programmes in Sierra Leone, Uganda, India, Senegal and Thailand. The social enterprise also operates its own [Think Tank](#) to share learnings with other academics and policymakers and offers tailored education and training experiences to companies, organisations and students.

The social enterprise has three key missions: running customised short-term courses, operating a Think Tank to share in-country experience and knowledge and designing programmes that focus on upskilling companies and organizations.
